The Principality of Monaco is a small territory measuring 2.8 km<sup>2</sup>. We advise against using your private vehicle to travel around. On arrival, it is best to leave it in one of the many public car parks and travel around by public transport, on foot or by taxi.

## ON FOOT

The best way to visit the Principality is on foot. A wealth of public lifts and escalators help you get to each district in just a few minutes.

It only takes 45 minutes to cross the Principality from East to West!

# Car parks

When in Monaco, you are advised to leave your vehicle in one of the many public car parks. They are all underground, guarded, secure and reasonably priced. They are your best vehicle parking solution.

Hourly and term ticket prices are displayed at the entrance to each car park:

• 1st hour free

• from 7pm to 8am: €0.30 per hour or €2 per night.

• Day tickets: €13 for stays of over 5 hours up to 8am the following day.

• Long term rates: €38 for 7 days and €65 for 15 days

# Taxis

"Taxis are vehicles equipped with special features whose drivers wait for clientele on the public highway to transport passengers and their luggage to the place of their choice in exchange for payment" (Article 12 of Sovereign Decree no 1.720 of July 4th 2008 on regulations governing taxis, limousines and municipal vehicles).

Taxi pick up rate is set at €5.25 day

Also mileage meters only start running from the time that the client is actually picked up, not from the taxi rank:

Rate "A" - intra urban zone: €1.57 per km

Rate "B" - intra urban zone night rate (from 7pm to 7am): €1.99 per km

Rate "C" - extra urban zone: €2.14 per km

Please note that taxis are authorised to charge a minimum fare of €7.50 during the day and €8.50 at night, Sundays and public holidays.

# Taxis-Bus minibuses

"Municipal public transport vehicles are vehicles whose drivers wait for clientele at a departure rank, to transport passengers and their luggage to the place of their choice in exchange for payment"

(article 33 of Sovereign Decree nº 1.720 of July 4th 2008).

"minibuses" or "taxi-buses" provide the same service as taxis for group transport. A minibus has between 8 and 13 seats. The two ranks are situated at: "Gare SNCF" and "Port de Monaco" Nouvelle Digue.

# ■ PUBLIC TRANSPORT

### ■ Daytime bus service (1, 2, 4, 5, & 6)

La Compagnie des Autobus de Monaco (Monaco bus company) services five bus routes between approximately 7am and

Basic frequency is every 10 mins on weekdays and every 15 to 20 mins on Saturdays and Sundays.

Unlimited travel, enables visitors to use all lines, including boat, for a whole day for just €3 (For sale on buses).

## ■ Evening & night buses (N)

La Compagnie des Autobus de Monaco also provides an evening bus service, daily from 9pm to 12.20am. It operates a single line which takes 45 mins to run the length of the Principality once every 30 mins.

On Fridays and Saturdays, night buses are laid on to supplement evening buses from 1am to 4am.

#### ■ Electric water bus

7 days a week, the electric water bus provides a ferry services between the two banks of Port Hercule, from quai Kennedy to Terre Plein du Fort Antoine. from 8am to 7.50pm, every 20 mins. Service is suspended in bad weather.



# GETTING TO MONACO...

### ■ BY CAR

Monaco is situated between Nice and Menton. You can get to the Principality via the national roads or the motorway. There are several different routes available depending on the time at your disposal and your circumstances.

#### **MOTORWAY**

A8/ E80 autoroute (motorway) known as "La Provençale" connects the Principality to France, Italy and the rest of Europe.

- From Italy there is a single, toll free exit to Monaco: N°58 "Roquebrune - Monaco la Turbie". Take the Vista Palace Hotel (D.51) slip road, continue on the Movenne Corniche (D.6007) coast road and come into Monaco via Beausoleil.
- From Nice, Cannes or Saint-Tropez, there are two motorway exits to the Principality. Exit 56 takes you directly to the Principality via the Moyenne Corniche, via a section of the A805 motorway

This is the fastest but also the busiest route, so expect slow moving traffic! Exit 57 takes you through the village of Turbie and then back down on to the Movenne Corniche. When you reach the Avenue de la Victoire du 8 mai 1945 junction, turn right and carry on towards Cap d'Ail. Finally take the avenue Prince Rainier III; and come into Monaco along the Boulevard du Jardin Exotique.

#### ROUTES

### From Nice

Although slower than the motorway, there are 3 beautiful coast roads to delight There are 3 very different routes.

### • "Basse Corniche" (D. 6098)

#### • "Moyenne Corniche" (D.6007)

The most popular route which takes you from Nice to Monaco in 40 minutes with sublime views of the Mediterranean. Make sure that you slow down. Speed traps are situated on the Corniche André de Joly (50 km per hr speed limit) and the Avenue Bella Vista (70 km per hr speed limit). The latter has one of the most beautiful views of Beaulieu-sur-Mer, the Saint-Jean-Cap-Ferrat peninsular and Rade de Villefranche between Villefranche and Eze-Village. On the way down to Monaco, the A8 autoroute slip road joins the Route de la Moyenne Corniche. Go along avenue Prince Rainier III, pass through Cap d'Ail before coming into the Principality on the Boulevard du Jardin Exotique.

### • "Grande Corniche" (D.2564)

The longest and highest route to get to the Principality, via La Turbie and the Col d'Eze, at an altitude of 512 m. If you are not pressed for time, take this stunning, breath-taking route. From the Moyenne Corniche, turn off at Villefranche on your left. Travel along the Parc Forestier Départemental de la Grande Corniche (Departmental forest park) and look out over on Eze-Village, Beaulieu-sur-Mer, the Saint-Jean Cap Ferrat peninsular, the Rade de Villefranche and enjoy the view as far as

Lower coast road between Nice and Menton serving Monaco. From the coast take the D. 6098 along Boulevard Carnot. Enjoy an unimpeded view of the Rade de Villefranche from the Boulevard Princesse Grace de Monaco. Continue on your route as far as Villefranche-sur-Mer. At the junction with Boulevard Napoléon III, take one of two famous routes crossing or following Beaulieu-sur-Mer famous, like Saint-Jean-Cap-Ferrat, for its sumptuous Belle Epoque style residences. Carry straight on as far as Cap d'Ail. Go into Monaco along the avenue du 3 septembre.



Registration certificates must be presented to the officer that controls access to the place d'Armes, at the foot of the old town (known as "le Rocher"). Other vehicles must make their way to the "parking des Pêcheurs" car park which has a pedestrian walkway into Monaco-Ville which takes just a few minutes.

#### From Menton

Other than the motorway, the easiest way is via the coast road. You will also drive through Roquebrune Cap Martin which will give you an opportunity to explore the villas on the route du Cap – an option which is pure tourist heaven! Further along, carry on until you reach the D.6098 which takes you to the Eastern entrance to the Principality, in the Saint-Roman district, above the famous site where the famous tennis tournament takes place.

# Monaco-Ville city access restriction

Access to Monaco-Ville is restricted to users of vehicles registered in Monaco and in the Alpes-Maritimes. For the new French registration plates, only vehicles bearing an Alpes-Maritimes territorial identifer whose owners can provide proof of residence in the department will be authorised to access Monaco-Ville.

Although it is possible to access the Principality by camping-car, this means of transport is not the most appropriate. Parking is prohibited on the public highway. Only the Parking des Ecoles (tel.: +377 98 98 81 83) in the Fontvieille

There is an extensive bus system on the Côte d'Azur with numerous connections between Nice and Menton, via Monaco.

TAM system Line 100 buses provide a daily service from 6am to 8pm. From Nice bus station there is a bus every quarter of an hour, from Mondays to Saturdays and every 20 minutes on Sundays and public holidays.

There are 7 stops in the Principality: les Carabiniers, Place des Moulins, Casino, Stade Nautique / Sainte-Dévote, Place d'Armes and Cimetière.

The 100 Xpress bus line travels between Nice and Monaco via the motorway. There is one bus every 50 minutes from Nice bus station and every hour from Monaco (Place des Moulins via the Place d'Armes), from 6.10am to 6.30pm.

#### Noctambus N100

On Thursdays, Fridays, Saturdays and on the eve of public holidays, the N100 line provides connections from Nice and Menton to Monaco from 10pm to 4am. Typical departure times from Nice are 10pm, 11.30pm, 1am and 2.30am. Principality / Nice / Menton service every 1hr 30 mins.

## **■** BY TRAIN

# All trains stop at Monaco / Monte-Carlo

TGVs to and from Paris (journey time 5hrs 30 mins): 1 during the day & 1 at night.

- Day trains to Milan, Gênes or Basle: 4 per day.
- · Night trains to Strasbourg, Paris, Toulouse, Irun, Port-Bou, Milan, Venice, Pisa & Rome.
- Regional express trains (Trains Express Régionaux - TER) provide an inter-city service between town and cities on the Côte d'Azur from Vintimille or Menton (East side) and Grasse, Cannes or les Arcs (West side).

5 large capacity TER trains (450 seats) in Principality livery provide extra train frequency on the regional system between Menton and

Rush hour (6.30 am to 9.30 am & 4.30 pm to 7.30 pm): one train every quarter of an hour. Peak: one train every half hour. Off peak: one train every hour.

3<sup>rd</sup> busiest station in the PACA region (after Nice & Marseilles), Monaco station is a "Gare Accès+". It has been adapted for mobility-challenged users. Assistance available on request.

### **BY BOAT**

Monaco has two deep water yacht harbours ports, on either side of the Rocher.

Port Hercule is an integral feature of the city. It offers mooring for boats up to 130 metres. Its breakwater provides a safe harbour in all weathers. It is also a host port for numerous cruise ships. The Maritime Police operates a permanent surveillance service.


